The Re-Entry Resource Program is here to assist and support adult learners, 23 years or older, who are new to college or returning after a break of three or more years. Our goal is to provide you with tailored services to address those concerns and help make your transition back into school as smooth and easy as possible.

WHAT IS A NONPROFIT ORGANIZATION (NPO)?

"A legal entity organized and **operated for a collective, public or social benefit**, as opposed to an entity that operates as a business aiming to generate a profit for its owners" (<u>Wikipedia</u>)

OVERVIEW

- 501 (c)(3) tax status
- Not driven by profit
- Dedicated to and invests in a specific cause
- Religious, charitable, scientific, literary, or educational purposes



WHAT IS A FOUNDATION?

"A type of nonprofit organization or charitable trust that usually **provides funding and support to other charitable organizations** through grants, while also potentially participating directly in charitable activities." (*Wikipedia*)

OVERVIEW

- 501 (c)(3) tax status
- Monetarily support other organizations or individuals
- Raise and disburse funds
- Public charity, private foundation, community foundation, corporate foundation, independent foundation, grant-making foundation



WHAT IS A SCHOLARSHIP?

"A scholarship is a form of financial aid awarded to students. Generally, scholarships are awarded based on a set of criteria such as academic merit, diversity and inclusion, athletic skill, and financial need or specific professional experience" (Wikipedia)

OVERVIEW

- Type of Financial Aid (others: grants, loans, work study)
- FREE MONEY that doesn't need to be paid back
- Used to offset some of the costs of attending college
- Delivered via check or deposited through Financial Aid

MERIT VS NEEDS BASED SCHOLARSHIPS

MERIT

- Based on factors such as academic, personal, and/or exceptional talents
- Students must meet certain requirements and/or are ranked by reviewers
 - Major specific (STEM, nursing, etc.)
 - GPA (3.0+, 3.5+)
 - Units completed
 - Involvement, Volunteering, Leadership
 - Military, Foster Youth, Re-Entry
 - Geographic (Downey Unified Grad)

NEEDS

- Based on individual or familial economic factors
- Must complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).
 - FAFSA asks a series of questions about parents' and/or students' income, assets, and other factors to determine how much need-based federal aid they might qualify for

ESSAY/PERSONAL

STATEMENTS



LETTER OF RECOMMENDATION

Recommendations are often provided by professors, mentors, professionals and others who will endorse you



UNOFFICIAL TRANSCRIPTS

Transcripts share your GPA, total units, class load, and other key details that help with scholarship selection



PROOF OF FINANCIAL NEED

Some needs-based scholarships require you to submit a FAFSA application & share your financial need calculation

CERRITOS COLLEGE FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIPS

- Offered to CC Falcons ONLY
 - Some only offered in Spring or Fall,
 others are offered in both semesters
- 50+ individual scholarships
- \$500 \$4,000 award amounts
- Both merit & need-based scholarships
- Historically, 1 in 5 applicants receive an award
- If awarded, must attend Scholarship Reception on November 6 & submit thank you letter





Your Story

- Where did you come from?
- Where are you now?
- Where do you want to go?

Include

- Educational and Career Goals
- Financial Hardship
- Do you have to work while going to school?
- Do you assist with household expenses?
- Do you financially support others?

Review

- Professionalism Counts... A LOT!
- Proof-read, edit, repeat.

In a minimum of 400 and maximum of 600 words, please tell us about yourself including your educational and career goals. Please feel free to include information that will give us a better understanding of you as an individual and why you should be selected as a scholarship recipient. If selected as a recipient, how would you use the scholarship funds?

(word count: 600)



PERSONAL STATEMENT QUESTION #2

Please tell us about any financial hardships that you may be experiencing. Many of our scholarships are need-based, so please be somewhat specific in expressing the hardship. (word count: 300)



COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT & VOLUNTEER EXPERIENCE

- Have you volunteered your time to serve and/or give back to your community?
 - If yes, please list any volunteer activities you have participated in within the last few years. Please include names of organizations where you volunteer, dates of your involvement, leadership roles, or community service activities, etc. (250 word count)
- Please describe how your volunteer experiences have positively impacted your life. (200 word count)

- 1.Go to www.cerritos.edu, click "Quick Links", then click "MyCerritos"
- 2. Sign in to your MyCerritos account
- 3. Click "View My Unofficial Transcript" under "My Information"
- 4.Click on the "Report Type" dropdown arrow and select "Unofficial Transcript". Click "View Report" and your unofficial transcripts will appear in a new tab
